Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

Entering October, the month that the universal Church dedicates to honoring the Virgin Mary through the Rosary, the memorial month of Jesus, the Incarnated Son, and the Blessed Virgin Mary, His Mother. The lives of the two most important persons in God's plan of salvation. Living the mystery of salvation means meditating and living the mysteries of the Rosary. Because hidden within the Rosary are the events in the life of Jesus: Incarnation, Preaching, Passion and Resurrection. When we meditate and pray the Rosary, we are entering deeply into the life of Jesus and Mary. Therefore, when living the mysteries of the Rosary, it helps us understand that: Each of our lives also has joys and sorrows, smiles and tears, just like the life of Jesus in the past, described through the mysteries: Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, Glorious. Through meditating and praying the Rosary, each of us is integrated into the life of Jesus and offers Him our whole life.

<u>Saints of October:</u> The month of October is filled with wonderful things: trees boasting bright and beautiful leaves, the scent of bonfires, and those blessedly cool days. I absolutely love everything about October, especially the month of the Rosary. However, as I've grown older, I've come to love October for a much more spiritual reason. October is a wonderful month with so many inspiring saints!

As we kick off the month of October, let's mark our calendars to celebrate 7 powerful feast days!

October 1st: St. Therese of Lisieux; October 2nd: Feast of the Guardian Angels; October 4th: St. Francis of Assisi; October 5th: Saint Faustina; October 7th: Our Lady of the Rosary; October 15th: Saint Teresa of Avila; October 22nd: Saint Pope John Paul II.

October has two feasts that express long-standing Catholic traditions: devotion to Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7) and to the Guardian Angels (October 2).

In October 2002, Saint Pope John Paul II wrote the Apostolic Letter Rosarium Virginis Mariae (The Rosary of the Virgin Mary) in which he added the five Luminous Mysteries. The Church invites the faithful to reread this Apostolic Letter to understand more deeply the beauty of the Rosary and to pray for it devoutly with their families during the month of October.

Every person has a Guardian Angel, and on October 2 the Church reminds us of their role. We should express our sincere gratitude to God for having placed these angels at our service. Having such a guardian will help us to be confident in all the difficulties of life. Every Catholic should regularly recite the prayer to the "Guardian Angel."

Guardian Angel Prayer: Angel Of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here, ever this day (or night) be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen.

Life magazine estimates that the "Hail Mary" prayer is recited about two billion times a day; and each year between five and ten million people make pilgrimages to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. Many believers also make pilgrimages to Marian sites elsewhere in the world.

Mary is prayed to as an advocate, protector, and helper. Even in sports, Mary's intervention has been mentioned: the last-ditch pass for a losing team was once called the "Hail Mary pass." Mary is also revered by Muslims. It is said that when the Prophet Muhammad cleared the Kaaba in Mecca of idols, he allowed only a fresco of the Virgin Mary holding the Child Jesus to remain. In the Quran, Mary is described as the one sent with the title "mercy to the world."

U.S. Representative Stephanie Bice recently visited our National Shrine of the Infant Jesus Prague this past September. I was honored to have her visit our National Shrine. She was very friendly and approachable. Senator Bice is a pro-life Catholic and a defender of religious to protect life and protect religious freedom.

Bice was elected in November 2020 to represent Oklahoma's 5th District. She told the group of professionals that her freshman year in Congress has been a whirlwind, including being chosen president of the freshman class in the U.S. House of Representatives. She is the first woman to be elected president of the freshman class.

"Running for public office wasn't something that had ever occurred to me, but it was actually my work in the church and in the community that inspired me," she said. "These are the things that I am being called to do, to help other families, to be of service ... to protect life and protect religious freedom. That's why I was elected."

Bice and her family are parishioners at St. Eugene Catholic Church in Oklahoma City. She said her faith has sustained her as she adjusts to serving in Congress.
